The Spark of an Idea

It all started with a birthday celebration in 2023. Surrounded by family in Nigeria, many of whom she was meeting for the first time, the founder experienced the freedom and confidence that comes with using a menstrual cup. No one suspected she was menstruating – no telltale signs, no discomfort. The surprised reactions and questions from other women sparked an idea: every woman deserves this same freedom. A conversation with Mommy Steph solidified the concept, and Cups of Change was born. Though the official campaign launch would wait until closer to the founder's journey on October 1st, the seed was planted during that memorable birthday gathering.

Our Mission

Our mission is to provide menstrual cups and education to women in West Africa, empowering them to manage their menstrual cycles with dignity and health. We also aim to create awareness about menstrual hygiene, address the challenges of period poverty, and challenge the stigma surrounding menstruation.

Our Vision

Our vision is a world where all women and girls equally have the same rights and access to menstrual hygiene products and education, and where they are empowered to make informed decisions about their health and bodies.

Period Poverty in West Africa

Period poverty is a significant issue in West Africa, where many women and girls lack access to affordable menstrual products and adequate sanitation facilities. This can lead to a cascade of negative consequences:

- **Missed Education**: Girls may miss school for several days each month, hindering their educational opportunities and future prospects.
- **Health Risks:** Lack of access to proper menstrual hygiene can lead to health problems and increase vulnerability to exploitation and harmful practices.
- **Social Stigma:** Period poverty is often intertwined with stigma and shame surrounding menstruation, further marginalizing women and girls.

Cups of Change is committed to addressing period poverty in West Africa through our programs and advocacy efforts. We believe that by providing access to menstrual cups,

education, and support, we can empower women and girls to manage their periods with dignity and confidence.

Our Programs

Cups of Change offers a variety of programs to support women in West Africa, including:

We have successfully engaged in awareness campaigns and educational outreach, reaching a growing audience through our online platforms. We are actively building partnerships and securing resources to ensure a successful and impactful distribution phase, with the aim of:

- Improving school attendance and educational outcomes for girls.
- Enhancing the health and well-being of women and girls.
- Reducing stigma and empowering women and girls to manage their periods with confidence.

Our Team

Cups of Change is led by a team of passionate and dedicated women who are committed to our mission. The founder, along with her sisters-in-law, Mommy Steph and Mona, bring a diverse range of skills and experience to the organization.
